

**Sierra Bonita Elementary**  
**Child Access Routing Plan**  
**53 S 1800 E, Spanish Fork**  
**2016-2017**

1. **The walking routes on the street system within the school boundaries:** We encourage parents to walk the route to school with their child prior to the start of school. (See Map)
  - A. Students living south of 400 North and west of 1430 East should cross 1430 East at the crosswalk located at 200 North and proceed east to 1800 East, and turn south.
  - B. Students living east of 1430 East and North of 130 North should proceed south to 130 North, proceed to 1800 East, and turn south.
  - C. Students living between 130 North and 100 South should proceed to 100 South or 130 North, to 1800 East, and then to the school.
  - D. Students living south of 100 South and north of US Highway 6, should proceed north to 100 South and cross 100 South at 1800 East.
2. **The school location:**
  - A. Sierra Bonita Elementary is located at 53 North 1800 East, Spanish Fork, Utah
3. **Existing traffic controls:**
  - A. Traffic Controls effecting Sierra Bonita Elementary include stop signs at streets perpendicular to 100 S, 130 N, 200 N, 1430 E, 1800 E; The school parking lot is marked with traffic control signs and the fluorescent green curbs that indicate no parking and bus loading zones.
4. **School crossings:**
  - A. There will be a crossing guard at 1800 East and 100 South.
5. **Loading/unloading areas for student drop off area (See Map):**
  - A. The parking lot is marked with signs indicating exits and entrances. These areas are patrolled before and after school by faculty members.
  - B. Students may be dropped off / picked up in the designated drop off / pick up areas, on 1800 East and 100 South. Students should cross streets at crosswalks and follow the directions of crossing guards and school faculty members.
6. **An explanation of the plan:**
  - A. This narrative with the map is the explanation of the plan.
7. **Instruction to parents to walk the route with their children:**
  - A. This narrative is given to parents along with the map. Parents are asked to walk the route with their children to ensure best access from individual homes to the main routes indicated on the plan.
  - B. These instructions are sent home at the beginning of each school year in the information packet given to all families.
