Review of Next Year's Goals (For those who were absent last month):

- We quickly reviewed the changes made to the goals with David and Heather, they both approved the Literacy and Math goals for next year.
- All other members approved them at our February SCC meeting

Review and Approve Safe Walking Route:

- Mr. Andersen shared the map of the safe walking route with the council
- Nothing has changed or been added such as new intersections or sidewalks
- Our boundary won't be changing so everything will remain the same
- Mr. Andersen meets with UDOT, SFPD, and the district each summer to go over our school plan.
- Nick asked if we have had any incidents on our route, Mr. Andersen shared that the only incident we have had is at the 4-way stop
 - One driver did not yield to the students walking but luckily the sister grabbed the siblings backpack and stopped them
- We encourage ALL parents to walk with their student along the safe walking route

Discussion of TSSA funds:

- Mr. Andersen shared the TSSA funds report and how that money is used
- He discussed how these funds do not need to be approved by the SCC members

Data Review from Spring of 2023:

Mr. Andersen shared the following Math data from Spring 2023

- o 3rd grade students were 58% proficient, almost 10% higher than State and District
- o 4th grade students were 73% proficient, almost 30% higher than State and District
- o 5th grade students were 56% proficient, almost 11-14% higher than State and District
- Nick asked the question with one of our grade level with a really high scoring class and a significantly lower scoring class, what happens there?
 - Mr. Andersen answered with there will always be a small variance between teachers and even the class, but when it is as high as it is the following happens
 - Grade level discussions
 - PLC data discussions
 - Working with that particular teacher to help them and see what changes need to be made
- Discussion was had that it is great that we are scoring above the state and district but there is always room for improvement
- We also discussed the importance of having students familiar with how to manipulate and use the tools available with the test

Mr. Andersen shared the following Reading data from the Acadience Reading Assessment

- Kindergarten 67%
- 1st grade 60%
- 2nd grade 72%
- 3rd grade 76% *Already meeting the goal proposed for 3rd graders in 2027
- 4th grade 84%
- 5th grade 75%
 - Mr. Andersen shared that the State has set a goal that 70% of 3rd graders be 70% proficient and on grade level by 2027

Things that are happening in our classrooms are headed in the right direction and we are making strides.
